Background



About 4 million workers in the Ready Made Garment (RMG) sector, of whom 80% are women!

Background contd...

- No leave/insufficient leave after childbirth
- Fear of losing jobs less time for child care
- Money shortage milk and other essentials (Mridula and Khan, 2009).
- Long hours of separation from children
- Especially difficult during breastfeeding phase (War on Want, 2015).

Justification

- **Babies** Frequently sick, undernourished, poor caring and feeding practices
- **Mothers** distracted, absent from work, earnings spent on medical consultations, medicines
 - No access to correct health & infant feeding information
 - No organised support system in the community
- Employers lose skilled workers
- Build upon TAHN's success with community-based peer counsellors



Primary Objective

To provide RMG employees with correct information and support for optimal breastfeeding, complementary feeding, and child caring practices

Methods

- Selection of project area
- Training communitybased women as peer counsellors
- Linking with health facilities in the RMG project area



Individual household visits for peer counselling



Monitoring counselling of a pregnant RMG worker

Weight and height measured in pregnancy, With encouragement for adequate care & diet



Mothers empowered with information and hands-on skills for breastfeeding

Challenges

- Awareness grossly lacking (PLW & IYCN)
- Long working hours
- Discrepancies in maternity leave and payment
- Very few ANC visits RMG workers lose money
- Absence of health facilities providing delivery services
- Women stressed about losing job/ finding another
- Scanty facilities for supporting breastfeeding at workplaces

- "Breastfeeding and Work: Lets make it work!"
- Unicef, ILO and few stakeholders agreeable for advocacy meetings
- BGMEA receptive and will participate
- Secretary, Ministry of Labour interested....
