WORLD BREASTFEEDING WEEK (WBW)



#WBW2018 celebrated breastfeeding as the foundation of life. UNICEF/WHO released a **Joint Letter in Support of World Breastfeeding Week 2018**, calling for everyone to recommit to doing more to help every child and realize the lifesaving benefits of breastfeeding. To date, WABA received a total of 879 **pledges** and 291 **reports** for events/celebration - keep sending us your reports to receive an e-certificate!

The WBW-SDGs campaign was discussed at the recent 2018 WABA Global Breastfeeding Partners' Meeting, and preparations for the #WBW2019 campaign has already begun.

We are proud to announce the **#WBW2019** theme, "Empowering Parents: Working towards the next 100 years of maternity/parental social protection" and our slogan:

WARM CHAIN OF SUPPORT FOR BREASTFEEDING



WABA met with representatives from Stone Medical Technology Beijing Research Center, BFHI Fund of Chinese Red Cross Foundation and the Department of Maternal and Child Health, National Health Commission of the People's Republic of China to promote the Warm Chain in China. We visited several baby-friendly hospitals in Beijing and discussed the warm chain concept with the hospitals' management teams. The concept was well accepted and they were eager to start work on creating warm chain links within their hospitals.

EMPOWERING PARENTS CAMPAIGN




The EPC was highlighted during the 2018 WABA Global Breastfeeding Partners' Meeting to develop action plans with partners that include furthering the expansion of parental social protection leveraging policies and advocacy opportunities especially during important milestones such as the **ILO Centenary** celebration in 2019. Three key elements developed for the EPC include (i) promoting the use of tools to improve legislation and uptake of the International Labour Organisation (ILO) C183 -Maternity Protection Convention, 2000 (No. 183), (ii) showcasing best practice models on enforcement of labour legislation and policies at the workplace around parental protection, and (iii) using communications strategies to promote and increase gender equitable social norms.

BE EMPOWERED

BREASTFEEDING ADVOCACY & PRACTICE (BAP) COURSE



The 8th **Breastfeeding:** Advocacy and Practice (BAP) course for doctors, midwives, senior health professionals and those involved in national or local infant feeding programmes was held in Penang, Malaysia from 9-23 September 2018. 25 participants attended the 2018 BAP course, fourteen were from Southeast Asia, eight from Africa and three from South Asia. We had groups of four participants from different countries, consisting of a doctor, midwife, nutritionist and a public health specialist to represent the necessary links needed to form the Warm Chain of Support for Breastfeeding.

SEED GRANTS PROJECT



A total of 20 seed grant projects were carried out by local organisations in 16 countries. The projects were linked to WABA's three main campaigns. The **Parent-Friendly Workplace (PFW)** seed grant projects, based on the **Empowering Parents Campaign (EPC)**, focussed on reforming laws to provide men with the necessary guarantees to support breastfeeding, establishing a multi-sectoral National Taskforce on Maternity Protection and Workplace Lactation Support Programme, and developing a sustainable partnership to ensure exclusive breastfeeding for the children of working women engaged as construction labourers. **The Warm Chain of Support for Breastfeeding** seed grant projects created awareness of the importance of linking mothers along the continuum of care and highlighted the importance of fathers and the community to support breastfeeding mothers. The **World Breastfeeding Week (WBW) seed grants** were used to celebrate the WBW2018 theme of Breastfeeding: Foundation of Life.

International Baby Food Action Network (IBFAN)



- International Baby Food Action Network (IBFAN) is organising the 3rd World Breastfeeding Conference and the 1st World Complementary Feeding Conference on 11-15 November 2019 in Rio De Janeiro
- IBFAN participated in the 40th Session of the Codex Committee on Nutrition and Foods for Dietary Uses (CCNFSDU) held in Berlin, Germany on 26-30 November, 2018. IBFAN contributed during the discussion on important agenda items concerning infant and young child feeding e.g. the revision of the standard for Follow-up Formula, the Guidelines for the Use of Ready to Use Therapeutic Foods (RUTFs) for malnourished children, and the Definition of Biofortification.
- IBFAN participated in the CFS-CSM Food Systems and Nutrition Working Group meeting in Rome on 3-5 December, 2018 and contributed by preparing the group for the CFS process to develop guidelines on food systems and nutrition

Academy Of Breastfeeding Medicine (ABM)



- At the Annual International Meeting (15-17 November 2018) in San Francisco, multiple topics were discussed among physicians and health care workers from around the world. Abstracts can be found in the Journal of the ABM
- The **24th Annual International Meeting** of the Academy of Breastfeeding Medicine will be held at the University of Central Lancashire, United Kingdom, from 16-19 October 2019.
- The revised ABM #7 Protocol, "Model Maternity Policy Supportive of Breastfeeding" (Maria-Teresa Hernández-Aguilar, Melissa Bartick, Paula Schreck et.al.) was published and Dr. Hernández-Aguilar, a physician at the Dr Peset Breastfeeding Unit, Valencia, Spain and National Coordinator of the Baby-Friendly Initiative in Spain (IHAN), wrote a **blog post** about it.
- Dr. Alison Stuebe, the President Elect of the Academy, wrote another blog about the importance of a community of physicians who care deeply about breastfeeding.
