**Sample Observations:** The differential feeding of girls causes them to be exposed to higher rates of malnutrition and longer periods or more severe morbidity, ultimately resulting in their significantly higher mortality

- Although a well-nourished pregnant woman can successfully continue to breastfeed, however, for women belonging to disadvantaged socio-economic backgrounds and residing in rural areas or urban slums, this can be potentially harmful to their already compromised health status.
