
During the official #WBW2020 week of August 1-7, we worked with our partners on several events to increase engagement and galvanise action on the theme. These include:

- Sharing an interview on the importance of skilled mother support especially during crises/emergencies



# • WHO/UNICEF/IBFAN published a **report** on the legislative status of the Code of Marketing of Breastmilk Substitutes, focusing on Code provisions for health workers and health systems. WHO simultaneously released an **information sheet** for health workers describing their responsibilities under the Code.

- Additional tools for breastfeeding and COVID-19 include:
  - FAQ document including patient flow charts to assist with decision-making.
  - Short video.
  - Community IYCF counseling cards.
  - **Clinical app** for healthcare worker training.
- During World Breastfeeding Week, the WHO Director General and UNICEF Executive Director issued a joint letter on skilled breastfeeding counselling.
- WHO and UNICEF published new materials for capacity building on BFHI:

## Alive & Thrive



- Conducted a review of COVID-19 guidance documents highlighting inconsistencies. The study was also presented during a webinar on COVID-19: Ensuring Safe Breastfeeding And Newborn Care: Lessons From Countries, organised by the Early Childhood Development Action Network.
- Celebrated, with partners, news that Lao PDR has adopted the Marketing of Breastmilk Substitutes Decree to protect and promote breastfeeding.
- Collaborated with the government of Burkina Faso and UNICEF to launch the Stronger With Breastmilk Only regional campaign on exclusive breastfeeding in June.
- For World Breastfeeding Week, Alive & Thrive moderated a regional learning cafe with UNICEF regarding the campaign, which can be viewed **here**.
- Published regional Cost of Not Breastfeeding briefs for Southeast Asia and West Africa (also available in French).
- Supported publication of the following research articles:
  - The Role Of The Opinion Leader Research Process In Informing Policymaking For Improved Nutrition: Experience And Lessons Learned In Southeast Asia.
  - National Nutrition Strategies That Focus On Maternal, Infant, And Young Child Nutrition In Southeast Asia Did Not Align Consistently With Regional Framework And International Recommendations.
  - Breastfeeding Practices And Associated Factors At The Individual, Family, Health Facility And Environmental Levels In China.
  - Health Staffs' Experiences With The Implementation Of Early Essential Newborn Care Guidelines In Da Nang Municipality And Quang Nam Province In Viet Nam.
  - Mistakes From The Hiv Pandemic Should Inform The COVID-19 Response For Maternal And Newborn Care.

#### **PATH**



- Collaborated with the Human Milk Bank Association of India (HMBAI) and Indian Academy of Pediatrics (IAP) to develop guidance on effective use of human milk during COVID-19 pandemic. The guidance was published in the Journal Of Indian Medico Legal And Ethics Association.
- Developed and disseminated **multilingual information brochures** on maternal support and infant feeding and COVID-19 for pregnant and lactating mothers and families.
- Organised a **webinar** to discuss guidance, experiences, good practices and recommendations on maternal support and newborn nutrition during the pandemic.
- Supported the Virtual Communication Network of milk bank leaders (more than 95 members from 37 countries) to write a paper on the provision of milk banking services during the COVID-19 pandemic. The commentary has been published in the 'Lancet Child And Adolescent Health' and the full paper will be published shortly in another peer reviewed journal.
- Our paper on facilitators and barriers witnessed by lactation management centers in India was published in Indian Pediatrics.
- On Human Milk Donation Day, we worked with facilities to collect messages and photos to contribute to the online photo mosaic which was released by GAMBA showcasing inspiring messages on milk donation from around the world.
- PATH and Pepal Foundation created a set of social media videos on leadership and breastfeeding guidance for health care workers in COVID-19, which was launched and disseminated during the World Breastfeeding Week:
  - Breastfeeding guidance for providers (English and Hindi)
  - Leadership for providers (English and Hindi)
- Featured an article on the organisation's role in ensuring newborn nutrition on its website. Further for the World Breastfeeding Week, we disseminated IEC/BCC material created under Mothers' Absolute Affection Initiative by the government of India to multiple stakeholders across country, conducted webinars and released a **poster** on universalising access to human milk along with partners at the seminar.

#### **International Confederation of Midwives (ICM)**



- This Year of The Midwife and the Nurse (YOMN) has truly demonstrated the reliant and imperative nature of our professions, and we will continue to demonstrate these traits as we look towards our plans for the remainder of YOMN.



#### **PEOPLE HEALTH MOVEMENT (PHM)**



- Webinars were organised on issues around the pandemic such as the need for global solidarity, the threat towards WHO by the US, access to medical products and technologies, view here and here.
- A number of **statements** were issued on concerns such as access to medicines, lockdowns, human rights violations, and US withdrawal of funding to WHO.
- A team attended the online WHA 2020 and reported the developments. Subsequently a **webinar** was organised on The COVID-19 World Health Assembly: A People's Assessment.
- PHM regional and country circles organised a number of **online meetings** such as on privatisation and role of private sector during COVID times (PHM Europe), discussion on the impact of COVID-19 in the Middle East and North America (PHM MENA), and access to health technologies (PHM South Africa).
- PHM participated in Town Hall meeting with the WHO-DG.
- Gender Justice and Health Thematic Group organised a meeting on Not In Lockdown: Voices And Struggles Against Gender, Racial And Social Injustices.
