### **EMPOWERING PARENTS CAMPAIGN**



The Empowering Parents Campaign focuses on ensuring parental social protection in line with international labour standards, promoting enabling workplace conditions and sharing of care

and domestic responsibilities and normalising supportive behaviours and attitudes at the home and the workplace.

As part of realising the goal for workplace support, the Breastfeeding Friendly Workplace (BFW) accreditation initiative is pioneered in the state of Penang, Malaysia. This initiative is coordinated by WABA in collaboration with other Making Penang Breastfeeding Friendly (MPBF) members. The Penang State government endorses this accreditation.

The first phase of the initiative will be a Focus Group Discussion with a few multinational corporations that have nursing rooms/facilities at the workplace. The initiative aims to accredit many workplaces in Penang and eventually in Malaysia.

**PATH** 



Updates for the period of January to March 2021:

- CHRI/PATH, in collaboration with Zonal Reference Centre JK Lon and the Government of Rajasthan conducted a two days virtual Lactation management training for community health officers and ANMs at Health and Wellness Centers (HWCs) in Rajasthan on 5th and 6th of January 2021. Over 300 participants from Rajasthan HWCs benefited from these training sessions.
- CHRI/PATH collaborated with NHM Rajasthan and ZRC JK Lon to facilitate and conduct a two-day on-site Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point (HACCP) training-of-trainers workshop in Jaipur, on 27th and 28th of January 2021.
- Supported for two days CLMC Orientation training workshop which was held by ZRC, JK Lon and Government of Rajasthan. It was attended by 25 participants across 5 new functional CLMCs in Rajasthan.

### Activities Planned from April to August 2021:

- CHRI/ PATH has created an e-flipbook, 'Stories of Change', showcasing stories of mothers, families and healthcare workers on breastfeeding and newborn nutrition and plans to launch it in May 2021.
- CHRI/PATH is developing a data management application with the Government Medical College (GMC) Chandigarh for collecting data from CLMCs/LMUs on critical infant feeding indicators and strengthening service provision through real-time monitoring and support.

### International Confederation of Midwives (ICM)



- International Day of the Midwife 5 May 2021: Follow the data, invest in midwives that's the theme of the 2021 International Day of the Midwife (IDM), and it is through this lens that ICM will lead the ongoing and growing efforts to centre midwives as fundamental to ending preventable maternal and newborn death and achieving SDG 3.1 (reduce the global maternal mortality ratio to less than 70 per 100,000 live births by 2030).
- This year's IDM will also coincide with the launch of the State of the World's Midwifery Report an updated evidence base and detailed analysis of the midwifery workforce across the globe.
